Specific Points of Advocacy, especially from BHES perspective (source OSD Dir. Seidel)

"A few things to know for your advocacy efforts -

- Senator Sam Hunt is on both the Senate Ed and Ways and Means, and he has indicated the budget work on special education might send more \$\$ than the policy work on those bills indicates, so we will be keeping a close eye on Ways and Means (S) and Appropriations (H).
- Right now the best universal meals proposal drops the eligibility to 40% FRL. Families at a school like BHES
 (which won't qualify for universal meals under the bill's current state) are in a unique position to tell the
 story of how important is it to provide universal meals in your community.
- You're also in a good position to point out that underfunded transportation may mean even longer bus rides for your kids to middle and high school"
